


Cherry Blossom & Autumn Colours

For this reason we have developed a program for selected destinations. This simple system sees us collect tips at the time of booking. We then pass these tips to our local staff and they take care of all the tipping. Easy! It is compulsory for logistical reasons that all tour members participate.





Let's talk fitness

At Bunnik Tours we don't put specific age limits on our tours, but we also recognise some travellers may find our itineraries challenging.

We have a duty of care to all tour participants and the tour guides, so we do impose a firm policy on the level of fitness required by all our clients to prioritise your safety and the safety of other travellers on our tours.

Our goal is for all our travellers to enjoy their tour, not struggle through it! This is why we want to work with you to ensure you are on the best possible tour for your fitness level. We do reserve the right to refuse bookings if we feel that the requirements of the tour are too demanding.

Bunnik Tours are for independently-minded travellers with good levels of mobility.

Our tours include:

- 1. Generous amounts of free time
- 2. Lots of walking
- 3. Local and authentic experiences including various modes of transport and accommodation

Bunnik Tours travellers need to:

- 1. Be able to walk 2-3 hours on uneven surfaces, on any given day
- 2. Walk up multiple flights of stairs and short, steep hills
- 3. Stand for 20 minutes without needing to sit down, often in hot/humid climates
- 4. Carry their own luggage
- 5. Get on and off various modes of transport without assistance, including small boats

Please note: Passengers who are 75 and over will be required to obtain a doctor's clearance before travelling.







Day 1. Depart Australia Day 2. Arrive Tokyo

Welcome to Tokyo, Japan's buzzing capital. This fascinating city combines the ultramodern with the ultra-traditional. Here we'll find an unlimited choice of shopping, entertainment, culture and exquisite food. After we check in to the hotel, we'll have the rest of the day at leisure to unwind after our flight.

Today is an exciting and fascinating day, dedicated to exploring Tokyo. We begin with a visit to the scenic and spacious Imperial Palace East Garden, which provides a calm oasis amid the bustle of Tokyo. The garden is the former site of Edo Castle's innermost circle of defence. As none of the castle's main buildings remain today, the garden has been created in their place.

Day 1. Depart Australia - Arrive Negombo

Welcome to sunny Sri Lanka, the tear dropshaped island in the middle of the Indian Ocean. Sri Lanka is brimming with friendly people, ancient history and lush jungles. On arrival you will be met and transferred to your hotel.

Day 2. Negombo

This morning is at leisure to unwind after our flight. Our sightseeing will begin late this afternoon

Cruise along the calm waters of the jungle-fringed Gin Oya River, listening to the tranquil sounds of the abundant birdlife. We'll watch the sunset before joining a local family for a hosted dinner on the banks of the river.

Our day begins with a visit to the medieval capital of Polonnaruwa. Built alongside a large artificial lake, the city is brimming with archaeological treasures. We'll discover the well-preserved ruins of palaces, stupas, bathing pools and exquisite rock sculptures of Buddha. This afternoon we travel to Minneriya National Park to enjoy a jeep tour. The park is home to a variety of wildlife, including sambar deer, leopards and elephants. The central feature of the park is the ancient Minneriya Tank, built in the 3rd century by King Mahasena. During the dry season (June-September) large flocks of elephants come to graze and bathe in the water. We'll return to Sigiriya late this afternoon.

Day 6. Sigiriya (I) BID

- Today we explore the famous rock fortress of Sigiriya - 'Lion Rock'. This UNESCO World Heritage-listed site was formed by magma from an extinct volcano and was home to Buddhist monks for many centuries. It is a truly impressive site. located on top of a vast 200-metre-high granite rock, some 750 steps up!
- Visit a traditional Sri Lankan village and be welcomed into a local home. Learn about daily life and traditional farming, and then feast on local delicacies!

Day 7. Sigiriya - Kandy

O BD After breakfast we begin our journey to Kandy. Along the way, we will stop at the Matale Spice Plantations, which grow a variety of spices including cinnamon, pepper and nutmeg. We will also visit the Coconut House, which is a wonderful opportunity to see how a local family utilises every element of a coconut tree. When we arrive in Kandy later this afternoon we'll visit the Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic of Lord Buddha. The temple houses one of the most sacred relics of Buddhism - a tooth of Buddha, collected from his funeral pyre.

Built by the British in the 19th century to escape the sweltering heat of the lowlands, this town still retains the charm of bygone days. High tea at the hotel awaits us upon our return

Day 11. Nuwara Eliya -**OBD** Tissamaharama

Travelling south towards the coast, our destination today is Tissamaharama (or Tissa). En route, we'll visit Ella's Ravana Falls.

★ We'll also make a stop at the Elephant Transit Home in Udawalawe, which rehabilitates orphaned elephant calves for release back into the wild.

Day 12. Yala National Park

This afternoon we embark on a safari in Yala National Park - the oldest and best-known of Sri Lanka's national parks. It's also believed to have one of the highestdensity leopard populations in the world. Driving along Sri Lanka's beautiful south coast, we make our way to the Dutch colonial town of Galle. This historic city is filled with Dutch colonial buildings, ancient mosques and churches. We'll take a city tour and visit its UNESCO World Heritage-listed sea fortress. We'll then stop to visit a hatchery that was set up to protect the endangered leather-head and loggerhead turtles. We'll also watch the famous stilt fisherman as they go about their trade.

Day 14. Weligama

Welcome to Kathmandu, the capital of Nepal. This diverse and historic city offers a variety of sights and experiences.

Day 2. Kathmandu

After breakfast, we'll enjoy a full day of sightseeing around frenetic Kathmandu, including Swayambhunath and Kathmandu Durbar Square.

This morning we fly back to Kathmandu. Enjoy some last minute shopping, exploration or relaxation before tonight's group farewell dinner and cultural performance.

Day 12. Depart Kathmandu

Today is at leisure before we transfer to the airport this evening and begin our journey home.

Day 13. Arrive Australia

Level of fitness: This tour features 2+ hours of walking, often across uneven ground and in areas of high altitude or heat and humidity on 1 or more days.

Please note: The infrastructure in Nepal is still being rebuilt after the 2015 earthquake, so it is important to keep this in mind while on tour. 

Day 2. In Transit

Day 3. Arrive Ashgabat

@ BLD

Welcome to Ashgabat, the capital of Turkmenistan. We'll begin exploring later today on a city tour. Highlights include the Parthian Fortress of Nisa, a UNESCO World Heritage-listed site, and Independence Park with its towering monument. We'll continue to Ertuğrul Gazi Mosque, the Carpet Museum and the Russian Bazaar. This evening we'll enjoy a group welcome dinner at a local restaurant.

Day 4. Ashgabat

Today we'll explore the area surrounding Ashgabat, beginning with the Arkadash Stud Farm to see the Akhal-Teke horses. We'll then visit Kipchak Mosque, which is believed to be the largest mosque in Central Asia.

We fly to Dashoguz this morning and then cross the border into Uzbekistan. Travelling by road, our destination is Khiva.

Today we'll explore this city on a full day of sightseeing, commencing with a walking tour of the old town. We'll visit the Barak Khana Seminary and Tillya Sheikh Mosque, known for its rare copies of the Koran. Our next stops are the Chorsu Bazaar, the Museum of Applied

Arts, the famous Tashkent Metro and Amir Temur Square.

Day 14. Tashkent - Oybek Border -Khuiand

We travel to Khujand in Tajikstan, one of the oldest cities in Central Asia. Upon arrival, we'll stroll through Kamoli Khujandi Square, see Timur Malik Fortress and learn about the history of Khujand at the Historical Sughd Museum. Our last stop is Arbob Cultural Palace, the former headquarters of a Soviet collective farm built in the 1950s.

Day 15. Khuiand - Iskanderkul Lake - @ BLD **Dushanbe**

After breakfast we travel by road to the beautiful mountain lake of Iskanderkul and learn about its glacial origin. We then continue to the city of Dushanbe, the capital of Tajikistan.

Day 16. Dushanbe - Bishkek

We'll delve further into the history and life of the Tajik people today starting with a visit to the monument of Ismoili Somoni, which is richly decorated in gold. We'll also walk through Rudaki Park and explore the local bazaar. After dinner this evening, we'll transfer to the airport for our flight to Bishkek in Kyrgyzstan.

Day 17. Bishkek

Today we'll explore the capital of Kyrgyzstan on a sightseeing tour, starting with Pobeda Square, Duboviy Park, Central Ala-Too Square and the Asian Bazaar.

😭 We'll depart for Bishkek city, where we'll meet with the locals and learn how felt carpets are made. We'll also have the opportunity to make our own carpet.

Our next stop is a small handicraft museum, with displays of silver decorations, horse saddle decorations and carpets. This evening we'll fly to Almaty, Kazakhstan's largest metropolis

Day 23. Almaty

Discover Kazakhstan on a city sightseeing tour of Almaty including the Park of 28

Panfilov Guardsmen. We'll also visit the Central State Historical Museum and take a cable car ride to the top of Kok-Tobe Hill for incredible views.

Day 24. Almaty
