Renting a Car in Portugal

When selecting a rental vehicle, take into consideration where you will be travelling, how many people will be travelling in the vehicle, luggage size and the kind of driving you intend to do. DriveAway Holidays offers a vast range of vehicles from small economy sizes to larger full-sized cars, 4WDs, convertibles and luxury vehicles. The ACRISS system will help you find a car that suits your needs. This is internationally recognised code which will ensure you get the same standard of vehicle wherever you rent.

Automatic and Manual Transmissions

Both automatic and manual vehicles are available in Portugal. Automatic vehicles are generally more expensive than manual cars and may be scarcer at smaller depots.

Do I need a Credit card?

Yes. A credit card will be needed when collecting, which will be used for a security bond. The deposit is generally the insurance excess of the rental car which depends on the category of vehicle you have booked and the rate type.

Collecting at an Airport in Portugal

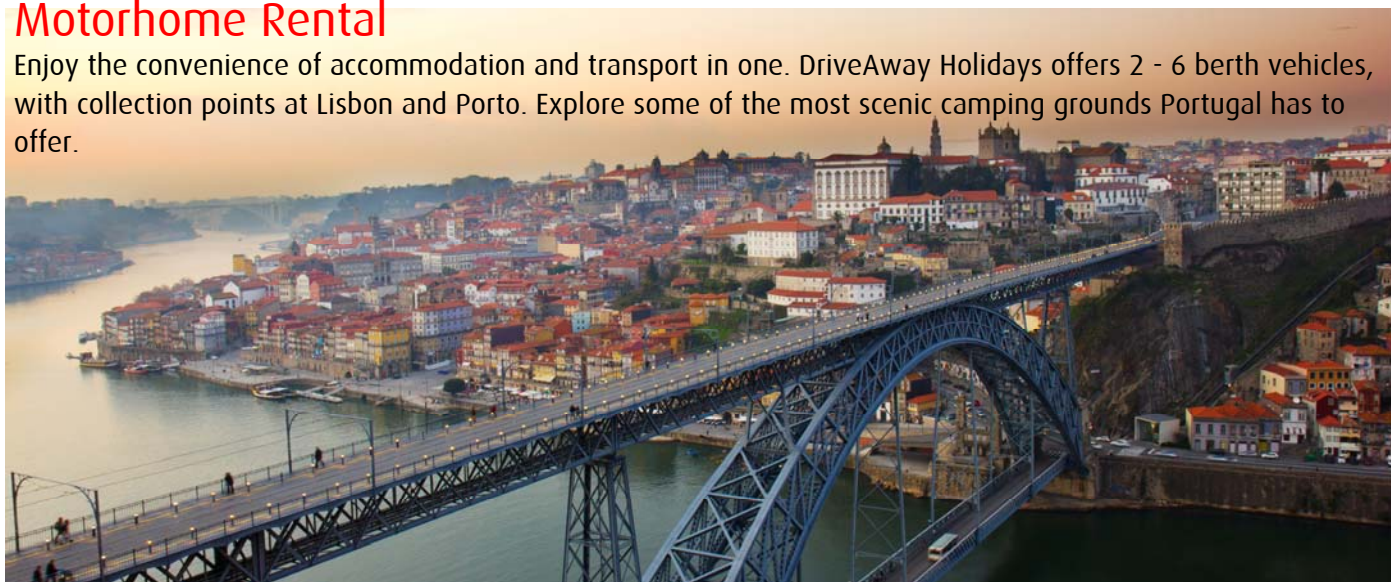
At most Portugal airports you will find your rental company has a desk in the arrivals hall, with the rental cars being located within walking distance. However, at smaller airports you may be required to collect your vehicle from a downtown depot. A courtesy transfer will be provided from the airport to the depot in this instance. DriveAway Holidays offer all-inclusive prices which generally include any location / airport fees and charges that may otherwise apply. **Remember to check at time of booking to ensure your rental will include all airport fees.**

Can I collect my rental car in one Portugal city and drop it off in another city in Portugal?

Yes, this is certainly possible. In some cases there may be a one-way fee charged by our suppliers when you collect your rental. DriveAway Holidays will advise you of any additional fees before you travel. In most cases, there are no fees for one way rentals within Portugal.

Motorhome Rental

Enjoy the convenience of accommodation and transport in one. DriveAway Holidays offers 2 - 6 berth vehicles, with collection points at Lisbon and Porto. Explore some of the most scenic camping grounds Portugal has to offer.



Rental Vehicle Insurance


Portugese law requires all vehicles to have compulsory third party (CTP) injury insurance, although your car rental supplier should already have comprehensive insurance covering their cars. In the case of an accident it must be reported to the insurance provider immediately and an excess will be due.

Car Rental Companies in Portugal will normally include:

- **Third Party Insurance:** Compulsory insurance and will be included in your car hire price. This covers you for other people's injury and damage to their vehicle.
- **Collision Damage Waiver (CDW):** This limits your financial liability for damage to the rented vehicle and is normally included in prepaid car hire prices. Rentals are normally subject to liability excess, which can be reduced at the time you collect your rental car or by taking out **DriveAway Hire Car Excess Insurance**.
- **Theft and Loss Cover:** This limits your financial liability for the loss or theft of the rented vehicle and is generally included in the prepaid car rental price.
- **Fire and Liability:** Limits your financial liability for bodily injury or death, and is normally included in the prepaid car hire price.
- **Personal Accident Insurance:** This covers the driver for personal injuries and is generally not included in your car rental rate. It is considered an optional extra that you can take out upon collection of the car.

DriveAway Hire Car Excess Insurance

When renting a vehicle, the rental rates include basic insurance, however, in the event that the vehicle is stolen or accidentally damaged, there is usually an Insurance excess amount which the driver is liable to pay to the rental company. To avoid any unexpected costs opt for DriveAway Hire Car Excess Insurance which will offer a reimbursement for the supplier's damage and theft excess to a maximum for AU\$5,000. Simply add this onto your car rental booking prior to departure and you could save thousands of dollars in the long run! Take a self-drive holiday in Portugal

- Driving in Portugal is not much different from other western European countries, where you drive on the right hand side of the road and overtake on the left.
- Always carry your driving license, vehicle registration document (V5), and certificate of motor insurance. Third-party insurance is compulsory.
- At the junction of two roads of equal size, traffic coming from the right has priority unless otherwise signified.
- In Portugal, vehicles already in a traffic circle have priority over those about to enter.
- Portugal has strict drink driving laws. The amount of alcohol allowed in the blood while driving is 0.05% with severe penalties for being over the limit.
- Always park on the right - you are not allowed to park your car facing oncoming traffic. Parking laws are strict and if violated, vehicles can be immobilized. Vehicles parked on pavements other when permitted as indicated by signs, are subject to the vehicle being impounded for a period of one month up to one year.
- The minimum age for driving is 17 years, though the minimum rental age is usually 23. Foreigners who have held a license for less than a year must follow certain rules. They must obtain a yellow sticker from the ACP motoring club with the number 90 on it. This indicates that they are allowed a maximum speed limit of 90 kph.

Driving Laws in Portugal

- Children under 12 years old are not allowed to travel in the front seat. Passengers under 135cm tall are required to use a child safety restraints or booster seat.
- Approved reflective jackets must be worn in case you need to step out of your vehicle on a highway.
- Warning triangles are compulsory.
- Spare lamps and bulbs are compulsory.
- Give way to traffic from your left unless otherwise signed.
- Mobile phones cannot be used whilst driving even when pulled to the side. You must park completely away from any traffic before using your phone
- Having headphones in your ears are also banned except for hearing aids.
- Dipped headlights must be used in poor daylight visibility.
- Seat belts front and rear are obligatory everywhere.
- Crossing white lines, jumping red lights, ignoring policemen signals, all are subject to losing a licence to drive from two months up to one year. Passing another vehicle on their right side then the driver can be fined up to €1,250.00. Drivers failing to respect for "Stop" signs can lead to a fine of up to €2,500.00.



Driving in Portugal

Parking

Do not park in areas painted yellow on the pavement, curb or where a no parking sign is displayed. In major cities, parking spaces marked blue on the pavement are metered parking, spaces marked with yellow are 'no parking allowed'. Before parking your vehicle, make sure to check for signage nearby, otherwise you may be left with a parking infringement and/or your car towed. Double parking is also illegal within Portugal.

Licence Requirements

To drive a rental car in Portugal, a driver will need to be over the age of 21 and have also held a full licence for a minimum of one year. An International Drivers Permit is also required for Australian Licence Holders.

Min & Max Age Requirements

The minimum age to rent a car in Portugal is usually 21. Surcharges apply for drivers aged 21-24 years old. Most car hire suppliers do not have a maximum driving age in Portugal. In some cases, aged drivers may be required to hold a letter from their GP stating they are healthy and fit to drive. Check with DriveAway Holidays at time of booking.

Cross Border Fees and One Way Rentals

Can I collect my rental car in Portugal and drop it off in another European city?

International one ways are definitely possible however, as with any international one way, this will incur a one way fee. Prices vary depending on the supplier, the length of the rental and the drop off destination.

Can I collect my car in Portugal, visit another European city, then return it to Portugal?

Travel is certainly possible to surrounding mainland European countries, as well as the United Kingdom. There will be restrictions on travel to Northern European countries in winter so advise DriveAway when you make your car hire booking if you're considering travel to these countries. Most suppliers will not permit travel to Eastern European countries. Driving outside of mainland Europe or the United Kingdom is strictly forbidden.



More Portugal Car Rental FAQs

Should I take out additional insurance on my car rental?

Rental rates will include basic insurance: Collision Damage Waiver (CDW), Third Party Liability and Theft Protection. In the event that your rental vehicle is accidentally damaged, regardless of who is at fault, or stolen, the Insurance excess is the maximum amount you are liable for. See page 4 for more details.

Should I hire a GPS for driving in Portugal?

GPS hire is available from DriveAway Holidays. Our rates include the GPS unit, travel guides and entertainer. The GPS is delivered direct to your home or travel agent before you depart. GPS units can also be requested direct with some suppliers, however this will be at their own rates. If time is short, or you would simply prefer to collect your GPS unit together with your rental, then this may be an option for you.

What do I do if I want to extend my car rental whilst I'm in Portugal?

Once the car rental has commenced you will have to call the depot where you initially collected the vehicle, and if the car is available to be extended, you will be offered additional days at the local rate.

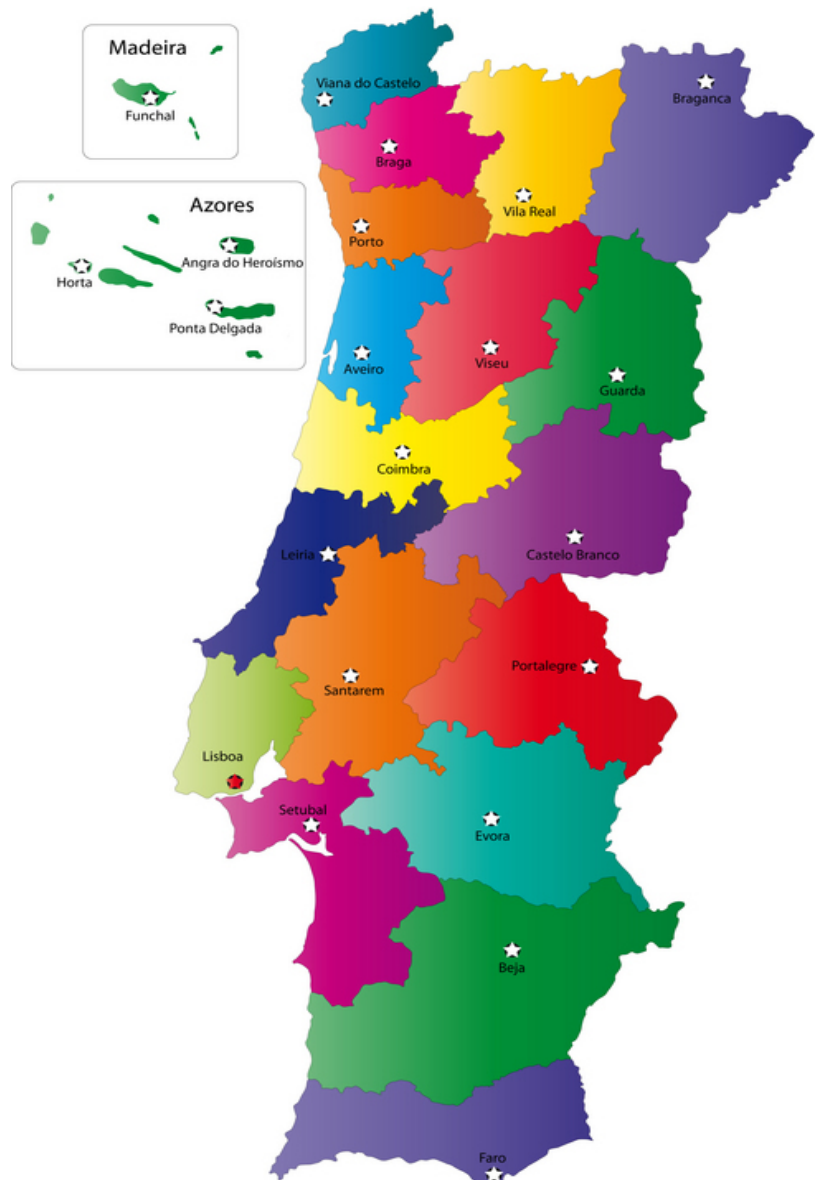

Porto & The North of Portugal

With sweeping valleys, mountainous ranges and a vibrant culture, the north of Portugal is fantastic for outdoor activities and exploring the natural surrounds. This region of Portugal offers a rural feel while also offering many cities to uncover and explore. Take to the roads and uncover the popular city of Porto to the west or explore the north east and find yourself in the city of Braganca.

Events

January

Dia de Reis: Celebrated on January 6th, the traditional King Cake is baked and eaten and is considered the end of a series of Christmas-time.

May

Serralves em Festa: Largest contemporary arts festival which takes place on the last weekend of May and lasts for 40h hours non-stop, with more than 250 activities for the whole family and it's free.

June

São João: People go to the streets and beat each other with childish plastic hammers. It is the major festival in Porto.

August

Assumption Day: Celebrated on August 15th each year. It is a festival made up of parades, street festivals, and costumed events throughout the day and finishes with fireworks at the end of the day.

December

Number of Christmas-time events celebrated with parades and street festivals. There are also arts and crafts fairs and other winter seasonal events at this time.

Attractions

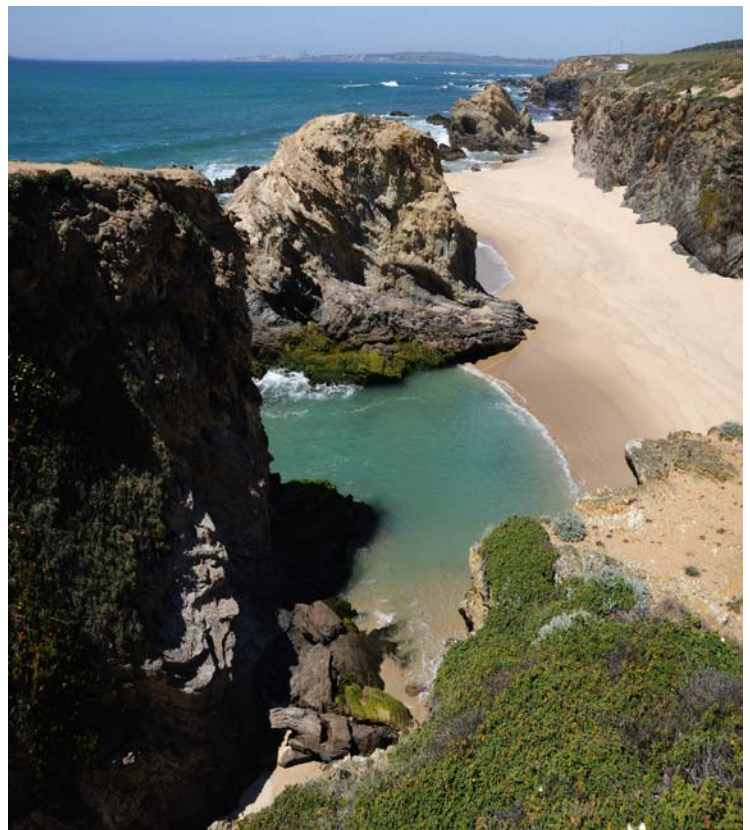
Serralves Museum—Discover the great architectural work that the museum has to offer.

Dom Luís Bridge – Built in 1886, this bridge links Porto and Gaia.

Cais Da Ribeira - The riverfront district of Porto which dazzles in colour and history.

River Douro - Great river that runs right down the middle of Porto. There are lots of restaurants and bars to stop and have fun.

Parque da Cidade do Porto - The biggest city park in Portugal.

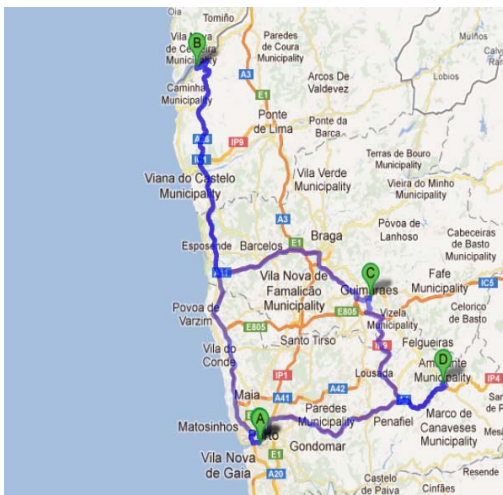


Porto & North Portugal

Porto- Guimaraes - Porto

Porto – Minho - Guimaraes - Amarante - Porto

Start your journey in the city of Porto , experience the historic buildings , beautiful riverside areas and



numerous museums in the region. While exploring Porto make sure to taste the world famous Port Wine which is produced in the area. From Porto start your drive north to Minho, which is a historic town with rich history and friendly locals. Stop by and explore the blooming gardens, or walk through the neighbouring forests. From here continue your tour south east to Guimaraes, the residence of the first king to rule Portugal. Wander the world heritage district and make sure to pay a visit to the famous Guimaraes Castle and the Palace of the Dukes of Braganca. Stop over in Guimaraes for the night at one of the many bed and breakfasts and taste the

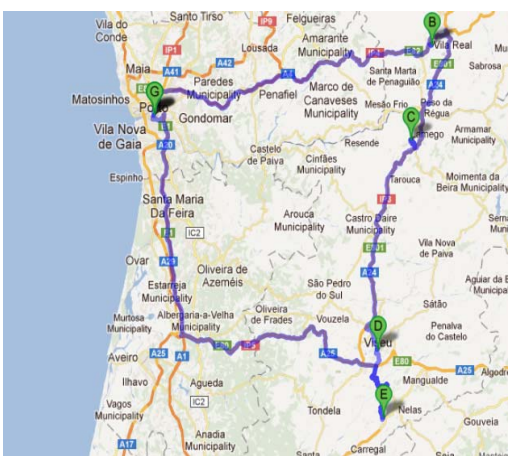
local produce at one of the restaurant's in the area. Once finished exploring, jump back into your rental car and drive south to Amarante. The town of Amarante is a picturesque scene with riverside terraces and granite bridges. Taste the local sweets or visit the towns Church. From Amarante, continue your drive back to Porto or carry on your journey south to other regional towns.



Porto- Viseu – Porto

Porto – Vila Real – Lamego – Viseu – Urgeirica – Porto

Start your journey once again in Porto and drive north on the Auto Estrada Porto -Amaranth. Along the way you will pass various little towns, forests and rivers. When you arrive in Vila Real, experience the laid back lifestyle



of the region and make sure to take the time to wander through the breathtaking gardens of Mateus Palace and also head over to the far east end of the town and view the Spanish Coastline. From here continue south through the wine country and take in the beautiful views of the land along the way. While driving south, look out for the small inland town of Lamego. Visit the rustic church at Sao Pedro de Balsemao only 3km from the town, or stay over night and experience the local produce and wine and explore this traditional region. Then continue south until you reach the ancient town of Viseu. Enjoy the mountain air in Viseu, wander the narrow streets in the hub of the city and explore the ancient cathedral which is the centre of the city. From

Viseu make your way back east towards Porto, stopping along the way at smaller towns such as Urgeirica , Estarreja Municipality & Ovar.

Beiras & Central Portugal

In the central part of Portugal you will find a range of coastal beaches and little fishing towns. Explore the popular fishing town of Nazare and relax on one of its pristine beaches. From Nazare continue inland and follow the stretch of roads up into the mountains and plateaus, here you will have the chance to explore the ancient forests and towns. When visiting the central part of Portugal also take the time to stop by the many attractions which are spread out across the region. Museu de Aveiro is a popular attraction found in the North of the district, here you will find a collection of furniture, ceramics, sculptures and information which is both in English and Portuguese. A short drive from Museu De you will uncover Farol da Barra, which is a light house towering 62 metres over Barra Beach. Visit the light house at sunset for a magical scene.

January

Festa das Fogaceiras : Festival held in Santa Maria da Feira Castle which requires young people to dress in white and carry local produce to fulfil a vow made back in the 16th Century.

April

Festival de Teatro da Alta Estremadura : A theatre festival held near the town of Leira.

May

Festas de Nossa Senhora do Castelo ou das Cruzes : Festival of Our Lady of the Castle or of the Crosses

Alianca Underground Museum - A display of unusual geological pieces and art.

The Maritime Museum of Ilhavo - A must to visit museum which is full of surprises.

Geopark Naturtejo - Geopark Naturtejo's landscape hides 600 million years of a highly diversified geological history

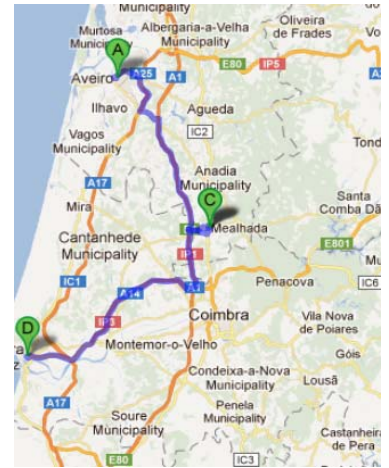


Self-Drive Tours-Beiras & Central Portugal

The West Coast

Ovar - Aveiro - Mealhada - Figueira da Foz

Start your journey in the little town of Ovar, which is known for its rich history. Explore the famous Calvario Chapel or stop on by the Ovar Museum and learn the culture of the Ovar people. Continue your drive approximately 50 minutes south to the lively town of Aveiro. Make your way up the canal which splits the town and view the antique architecture of the northern district, or expand your knowledge of the local arts and stop on by Museu de Aveiro and view the sacred collections. Then continue your drive to Mealhada, a small town which is famous for its traditional pork dish served throughout Portugal. Another popular town close to Mealhada is Luso, home to Portugal's popular thermal spas, attracting thousands of visitors a year. From Luso, you will have the choice of continuing your journey through to the town of Coimbra or make your way across the highway to the coastal town of Figueira da Foz, which is renowned for its stretch of white sand and pristine waters. Try your hand at one of the many water sports like scuba diving, surfing and canoeing, or explore the local theme parks such as Aqua Park Teimoso & Forest Adventure for some great family activities.



Inland drive

Coimbra - Covilha - Castelo Branco - Fatima - Batalha

Your road to discovery starts in the small town of Coimbra, featuring cobblestone lane ways, beautiful views and an old Portugal feel. Explore the cathedrals, museums and churches or



stroll through the upper and lower town alleyways. Experience the local cafes which are scattered throughout the area and make sure to also stop by one of the many ceramic shops in the region. Continue your journey to Covilha to visit the famous Santa Maria Church which is covered in decorative blue tiles. While exploring Covilha you will also find opportunities to take photos of the picturesque town at one of the many scenic lookouts. Carry on your trip south to Castelo Branco, where you will uncover the outstanding Jardim Episcopal, a collection of beautiful gardens, walk ways and 18th century statues adjoining onto the palace. From Castelo Branco we suggest you head east stopping over to view the world famous Our lady of Fatima in the little town of Fatima or stop over in Batalha and view the beautiful architecture of the Monastery of Batalha.



Lisbon & South Portugal

South Portugal is known for its sweeping coast lines and breath taking sceneries. Explore the region and uncover the many coastal cities and towns and their rich history and customs. Relax at one of the small towns, take in the views, taste the local cuisine or buy some locally made souvenirs. Throughout your travel you will also discover many of these small towns and cities hold grand celebrations and festivals annually and which cannot be seen anywhere else in the world.

January

Portugal holds its annual Winter Festival which celebrates art and music.

February

Carnival – Mardi Gras – Algrave

May

Rock in Rio – A massive music festival held over several days with international acts.

July

Estoril Music Festival - Annual music festival lasts for five weeks and takes place in July and August with a programme of modern jazz as well as classical music and chamber recitals.

August

Jazz em Agosto - Annual jazz festival held in the gardens of the Gulbenkian Centre in Lisbon

October

Feira de Santa Iria in Largo de S. Francisco

November:

International Lighting & Urban Art Festival.

Attractions

JERONIMOS MONASTERY A World Heritage monument which was also Vasco da Gama's resting place.

BELEM TOWER

Built in 1515, it is Lisbon's famous icon and a symbol of the Age of Discovery.

CASTLE OF ST. GEORGE

Overlooking the city from millennium-old walls, Saint George's Castle can be seen from almost everywhere in the city. Its oldest parts date from the 6th century.



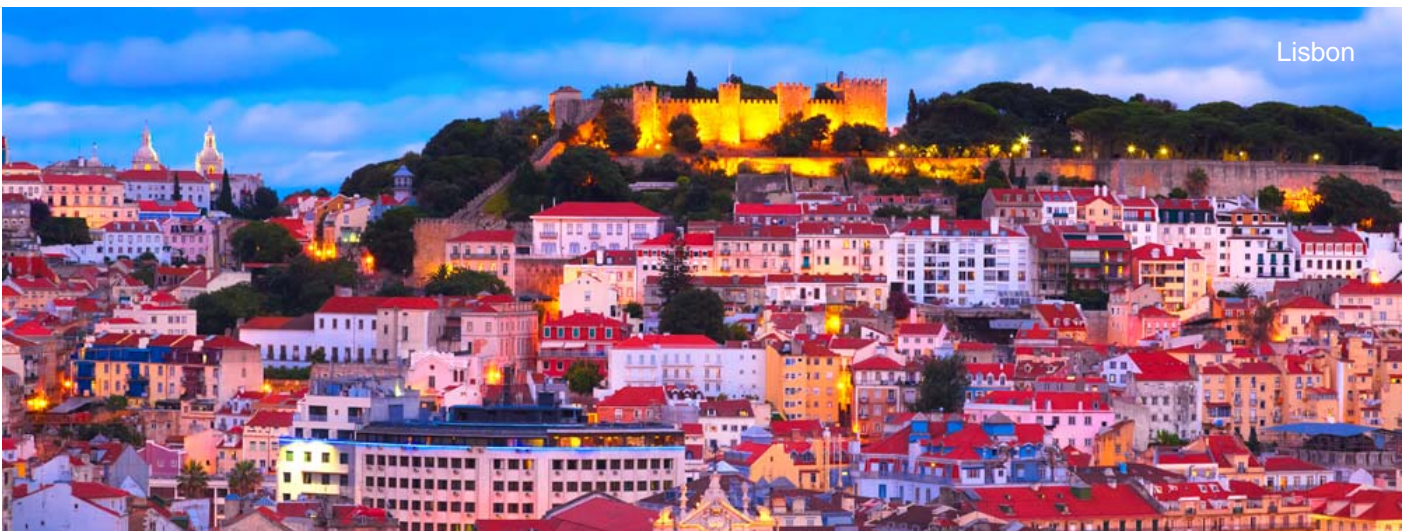
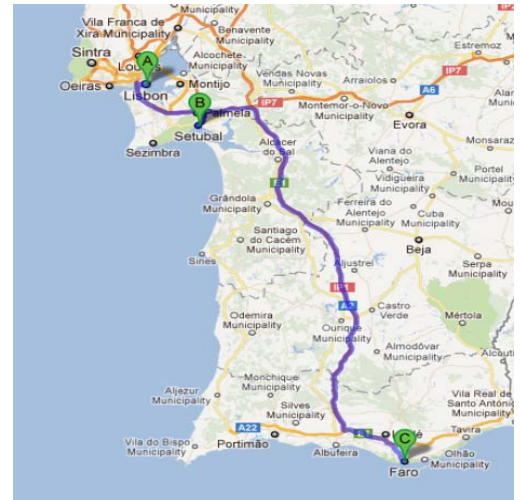

Self-Drive Tours in Lisbon & South Portugal

West to South

Lisbon – Setubal – Faro

Your journey starts in the well known city of Lisbon which is located on the east coast of the country. Explore this wonderful place and visit the famous St Georges Castle, Belem Tower and Jeronimos Monastery. Another great place to uncover is Alfama which features small streets, colourful buildings, great bars and restaurants. Then take a short journey south to Setubal and take a walk along the coast or view the resident dolphins on one of the local dolphin watching tours. Just 1 hour east from Setubal you will also find the little town of Evora which is home to the well known Chapel of Bones and The Roman Temple. From Evora continue your journey 2 hours south until you reach the city of Faro which is rich in history and character. While in Faro take the time to visit one of the local beaches or take a day trip on one of the regular ferries to Ilha da Barreta which is known for being a quiet and relaxing beach.



A Great Day Trip North

Sintra - Torres Verdras – Santarem

Start your journey in Sintra the town of romance, historical buildings and green surrounds. Kick off your trip by heading over to the Quinta da Regaleira, a palace which is said to provide visitors with a feeling of mystery and magic. While in the region also stop by Moorish Castle and Palacio da Pena for some great holiday snaps. From Sintra continue your journey north to Torres Verdras which is know for its refreshing wines and many hills. While uncovering the area, visit the famous Lines of Torres Vedras which were said to be built back in 1809 to keep out troops during the Peninsula War. If you continue 1 hour north east you will stumble across Santarem which is known for being a very religious place in Portugal. In Santarem you will find a beautiful Moorish Castle, Marvila church and many other historical buildings.





Climate & Weather

Portugal's climate can vary in temperature from region to region. Generally in the north it can be quite wet, whilst in the south it can be hot and dry. April through to October is usually the best time to visit as it's generally warm and sunny, although July and August can get quite hot with temperatures reading over 30°C. Chilling cold weather will be experienced towards the end of the year from December until February. The central part of Portugal is usually the coldest with temperatures below minus zero.

Language & Useful Phrases

Portuguese is the official language of Portugal, however English is also used as a second language within the country. Here are a few common translations that may come in handy. Most people can speak a little English, particularly in the main cities and tourist centres. You will find that if you try to speak some Portuguese, even if it's poor, the locals will appreciate your efforts and respond in kind. Here are some common phrases that may help:

Stay Healthy

Portugal's water quality is quite good and drinkable in some major cities. However, we do recommend that you keep to the bottled water. During the summer months it can get quite hot with strong UV's, so it is highly recommended to use sunscreen. When eating out try and avoid undercooked meat or fish as some fish may contain toxins or bacteria. Also stay away from unpasteurized milk as this can contain micro-organisms that can cause disease or infection. Hospitals are well maintained and are easily accessed in major cities, but before heading out on your trip make sure that you have taken out travel insurance.

Stay Safe

Crime : Portugal is quite a safe country to visit. The main thing to watch out for, like many other countries in Europe is petty theft. Scamming is one method used by thieves in Portugal so make sure that you keep vigilant throughout, however don't let this ruin your trip.

Beaches : Many beaches in Portugal have beach-safety flags. A green flag means it's safe to swim, yellow is to be careful and stay close to the shore, and red means dangerous 'do no swim!' Animals are not allowed on beaches. First-aid can be found with a Red Cross posted along the beach. Rock beaches can have hidden sea creatures that can bite or sting you, so it's recommended to bring along rubber shoes. Keep a close eye of your belongings. Use lockers or a cloak room if available.

Money Matters

Currency

The local currency in Portugal is the Euro.

ONE EURO (€) = 100 cents. (céntimos)

Notes are in denominations of €500, 200, 100, 50, 20, 10 and 5.

Coins are in denominations of €2 and €1, and 50, 20, 10, 5, 2 and 1 cents.

Currency Exchange

Money can be changed at any bank and at most travel agencies, major hotels and airports.

Banking Hours:

Generally banks are open Mon-Fri 0830-1500.

ATMs

ATMs are located in almost all towns and cities, especially in most banks, and accept major credit and debit cards.

Credit Cards

Most credit and debit cards are accepted. Contact your credit card company immediately if your credit card is lost or stolen.

Traveller's Cheques

Traveller's cheques are quickly disappearing from use, but can still be changed at main bank branches or exchange bureaux and some major hotels. These days it is more convenient to travel with debit/credit cards.

Tax

In Portugal, a value-added tax (VAT) of 23% is applied on goods and services.

Tipping

Tipping in Portugal is important and is generally around 10%.
